### REFLECTION:

The influenza viruses are single-stranded RNA orthomyxoviruses. They are classified antigenically as types A, B or C, but only influenza A and B are clinically important in human disease. In most years, minor or major epidemics of type A or type B influenza occur, usually during the winter months in temperate regions.

It is estimated that there are an average of over 13 500 hospitalisations due to influenza per year in Australia and over 3000 deaths per year in Australians aged over 50 years alone.
