REFLECTION:

In Australia, methamphetamine has now superseded alcohol as the drug of most concern to Australians. It can be smoked, snorted, ingested or injected. Acute intoxication with amphetamine-type stimulants such as crystal methamphetamine ("ice") can be associated with disturbed behaviour including agitation and psychotic symptoms such as delusions and hallucinations. Adverse cardiovascular and cerebrovascular effects can also occur. This session explores the incidence, effects and actions to be taken when dealing with methamphetamine associated problems.
