REFLECTION:

Buerger's disease, also known as Thromboangiitis Obliterans, is a non-atherosclerotic inflammatory disease of unknown aetiology, which has a strong association with tobacco. This condition affects men ages between 25 and 35 years and can involve arteries, veins and nerves of arm and legs. Extraordinary manifestations of TAO can involve the gastrointestinal, cerebrovascular, coronary and renal arteries. Amputation is regularly a consequence of this condition. This session explores the aetiology, symptoms and treatment options of this disease.
