REFLECTION:

Bowel dysfunction due to spinal cord injury (SCI) results in 'fecal incontinence and severe constipation termed 'neurogenic bowel dysfunction' (NBD) and is very damaging to quality of life'. Even when a bowel routine to manage the problem is effective it can be onerous and time consuming, and may take up to 1-2 hours per session, repeated every day or alternate days throughout post-injury life.
